Purpose

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Installation Requirements

To minimise contamination of any part of the drinking water supply and to eliminate impact on building occupants, water services installation must be carried out in accordance with Part B5 of the National Construction Code (NCC), Volume 3. This requirement also applies to installation of cold water, heated water, non-drinking water, firefighting water services, unprotected water services and rainwater.

Where one or more dental consoles are required to be installed in a dental surgery, attention must be given to ensure the installation does not compromise the drinking water service or supply.

The individual protection hazard rating for dental consoles is medium, and the zone protection hazard rating for dental procedure rooms is high, therefore the appropriate cross-connection control device in accordance Part S41C4 (2) (b) and Part S4C5 (3) (d) must be installed.

Each of these hazard ratings, associated with the dental surgery, must be considered and installation of dental consoles must comply with Section 4 of AS/NZS 3500.1.




Figure 1: Example of a typical dental console water supply connection

The Figure 1 below shows an example of a typical cold water supply connection to a dental console incorporating an isolation valve, a backflow device, a line filter and a pressure limiting valve.
