

VBA welcomes new Commissioners

The Victorian Building Authority (VBA) has welcomed four new Commissioners appointed to the building and plumbing regulator's Board.

The VBA Board sets the direction and priorities and oversees the delivery of the regulator's objectives and functions.

New appointees to the VBA Board include Dr Gillian Sparkes AM, Thu-Trang Tran, Murray Coleman OAM and Simon Weir.

Simon Weir is a barrister with more than thirty years' experience in personal injury and insurance litigation. He has worked as a Partner of Slater and Gordon and was a Senior Legal Counsel for the Victorian Workcover Authority.
